

in very serious cases it can – for example non-disclosure of a drug drive offence which would have led to declining to offer terms) In your case the difference would likely have been a higher premium had you said you intended to commute as opposed to the insurer not offering a policy. Your insurer should compensate the driver but is within its rights to make you repay your share (50%) of the losses of your opponent.

Motor insurance policies are policies of good faith meaning both parties in the contract have to disclose the correct required information commuting on a non-commuting policy then your insurer is likely to deal with your opponent's claim rather than cancelling your policy as if it never existed at all (which
